Welcome to the End of Year Newsletter 2024!

What an incredible year we have had here at Dan y Coed!! Becoming a Highly Recommended Independent School in the National Awards and the first school in Wales to achieve the Gold LOtC Mark in the Autumn Term. The year has been filled with lots of new experiences for all pupils both in school and out in the community providing opportunities to foster and develop new skills whilst consolidating others.

Over the year we have welcomed new pupils, DM, EP, RD and SAMF into Dan y Coed who have all settled into daily life exceptionally well whilst pupils JM and GP have had positive transitions into new classes. More recently NM has joined us in the residential home and has been exploring the school, becoming familiar with routines and new friends before starting afresh in September. Pupils continue to work together to run the DYC MAC Bank each week as well as the snack bar daily as part of our Careers and Work Experience opportunities on site. We have been broadening our offsite CWRE opportunities with pupils being trained up by Smyth's Toy Store and continue to volunteer weekly at Many Tears Dog Rescue. Next year we have the exciting opportunity to be working closer with MAD Swansea who are supporting us in developing our ICT curriculum to further develop pupils' ICT skills.

We have also welcomed a number of new Learning Support Assistants to support our growing number of pupils into the Dan y Coed family, in addition, Conor Lloyd our Wellbeing Lead across Orbis Schools and

Jodie Payne who will be the new teacher in Class 2 from September, already working in class as agency to develop relationships with the pupils and prepare for a new year ahead! A very special staff member who began her working life in DYC is Tuxie the reading dog who visits every Thursday along with her owner Sarah and listens to some of our pupils read. This is a fantastic scheme through Burn's By Your Side which trains dogs to be able to listen to pupils who lack the confidence to develop their fluency and self-esteem as readers.



There are changes to the Leadership Team structure for September where Emma Thomas will be the Executive Head of Education across Orbis, whilst Claire Williams will be the Head of School, with Mel Wright as Deputy Head and Kim Matthews as Assistant Head.



Unfortunately, we are saying goodbye to two larger-than-life characters who have come to the end of their journeys here at DYC. AD is flying the nest to attend Gower College where he has been accepted onto Pathway 2! A phenomenal achievement and we are all so immensely proud of him! TH will remain with his care home, Ty Richards, where they are planning on continuing with some of the fantastic things that TH does in DYC including his work experience at Smyth's Toy Store where he will be able to work alongside his ex-peers. TH will also join us again in the future to complete both his Bronze and Silver Duke of Edinburgh Awards by participating in the expeditions planned for 2024/25!
